

Slide set-up

Consider background color

- White background might be hard to view
 - Best for printing
- Dark background provides best contrast
 - Harder/more ink to print

Real. Life. Solutions.

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Overall tips

- You already have great content
- Treat the slides like an outline
 - YOU are the key element, not the slides
- Don't be afraid to use LOTS of slides with minimal info on each, **BUT...**
- Avoid **Death by PowerPoint!**
 - a.k.a. "Information Fatigue"

Mix it up

Text, photos, charts/graphs, other graphics

- Avoid "information fatigue"
 - causes stress, poor decision-making and mental exhaustion <http://www.newsweek.com/science-making-decisions-68627>
- **Puppies & Kittens** – "The Power of Kawaii", 2012
 - Cute or "kawaii" images increase cognitive skills, promoting careful behavior, narrowing focus and enhancing motivation

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Don't Write a Book

Please do not write in complete sentences when including text in your slides. You will immediately lose your audience because it is hard to read and completely distracts them from listening to anything you say while that text is on the screen. Is all this text really important? If so, you may want to consider creating a handout with additional information to provide to your audience after the presentation is over.



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The Power of Bullets

- Talking points
- Short/consise
- Organized
- Notes to trigger info recall



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Font Choices

Be careful of...

- Fancy or scripty fonts
- Too small or very thin fonts
- Fonts meant for children's books
- Non-contrasting colors

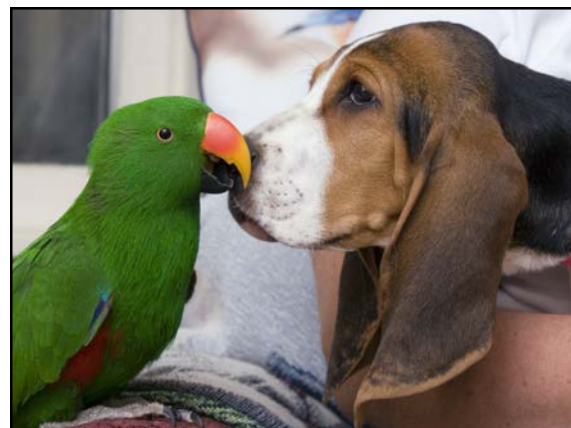

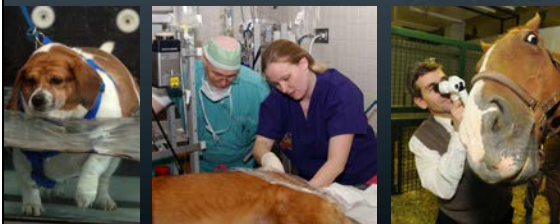
Is this legible?

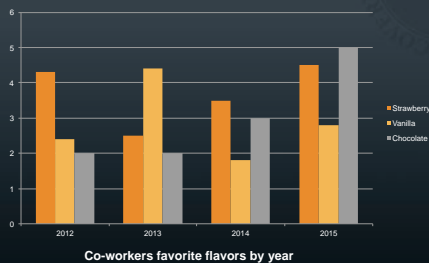
CONFUSION

Get a second opinion – Test your presentation!

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Charts & Graphs – Use them!

- Tell the story at a glance



Multimedia = Added Value

- Adds extra detail or interest
- Gets your audience interested
- Keep short so you don't lose/bore them
- Possible playback/linking issues
- Possible compatibility issues
- **TEST before you present** and seek A/V help if you need it!

TECHNOLOGY

Technology Issues

- **TEST** before you present
- Software may not be the same version
- Fonts may not be the same
 - Embed fonts if you can
- MAC to PC issues & vice versa
- Again, always **TEST before you present**
