BRACHYCEPHALIC OBSTRUCTIVE AIRWAY SYNDROME (BOAS)

Protocol for Preoperative Care in Dogs

Fasting should be extended to 12-18 hrs preoperatively for mature dogs

All dogs should come into the hospital with medications to reduce stress/anxiety:

- Can use these as singular agents or together depending on the patient's stress level
 - Trazodone 4-6 mg/kg PO 30 min before the car ride
 - Gabapentin 10 mg/kg PO 30 min before the car ride

Dogs with a history of vomiting, gastroesophageal reflux, or other gastrointestinal signs:

4 days prior to appointment:

- Omeprazole 1mg/kg PO q12 hr
 - If not tolerated (diarrhea or vomiting, decrease to q24hr dosing)

36-48 hours prior to appointment:

- Antiemetic of some sort (either is fine)
 - Cerenia 2mg/kg PO q24hr
 - Ondansetron 0.5 mg/kg PO q12hr
- Cisapride (ordered from compounding pharmacy prior) 0.5-1.0 mg/kg q12 hours
 - · Please make sure owners bring this medication so can be continued postoperatively

Dogs with no history of vomiting, gastroesophageal reflux, or other gastrointestinal signs:

- 36-48 hours prior to appointment:
 - Ompeprazole 1 mg/kg PO q 24hr
 - Metoclopramide 0.5 mg/kg PO q8hr
 - Antiemetic of some sort (either is fine)
 - Cerenia 2mg/kg PO q24hr
 - Ondansetron 0.5 mg/kg PO q12hr
